

# DAVSIL

DAVSIL is an elastic one component acetoxy cured silicone sealant available in a variety of colours. It is suitable for sealing applications, and for expansion joints.

## USES

DAVSIL can be used for:

- Expansion joints
- Sealing junctions between tile and bath, cupboards, shower bases etc.
- Joints where tiled walls and floors meet
- Internal and external applications
- Joints up to 25mm wide and 12mm deep
- Sealing of pipes, air ducts, aluminium frames, windows etc.

## FEATURES AND BENEFITS

- DAVSIL is ready-to-use, is easy to apply, seals quickly and leaves a clean finish
- Being silicone-based, DAVSIL remains elastic, making it ideal for use in areas where continuous movement is expected
- DAVSIL provides good thermal stability, UV, and weathering resistance
- DAVSIL provides effective long term sealing, and is suitable for professional, industrial and DIY use.

## SURFACE PREPARATION

- Ensure all joints are clean and dry and free from dust, grease, oil, wax, old sealant and any other loose contaminating materials.
- Excess adhesive must be raked out of the tile joints prior to the application of DAVSIL.

## **APPLICATION**

• Cut the seal on the cartridge and then cut the nozzle at a 450 angle.

- Using a cartridge gun, push DAVSIL into the joint ensuring the entire depth and width of the joint is filled. For optimal joint movement, use a backing rod (Abelrod), to ensure that DAVSIL adheres only to the two working surfaces.
- Apply only as much DAVSIL as can be worked before a skin forms -- up to 10 minutes depending upon the temperature.
- Use a spatula or paddle pop stick frequently dipped in detergent solution, to remove excess DAVSIL and form a smooth, neat joint. Taping of joints may be necessary depending on the type of tile and clean up method.

### COVERAGE

As a general guide, a 300ml cartridge will cover approximately 8 lineal metres when used in a 6mm x 6mm joint.

### CLEAN UP

Excess DAVSIL can be cleaned up using mineral turps while it is still wet.

#### PRECAUTIONS

- Do not use in immersed situations such as inside swimming pools.
- Tape edges on porous substrates.
- When using DAVSIL, ensure area is well ventilated, as vapours may irritate respiratory system.
- Avoid contact with eyes as irritation may occur. May cause allergic skin sensation.
